

## Old vs. New Testament (Part II)

- Christ, the Fulfillment of Old Testament Prophecy
  - the virgin birth (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:21-23)
  - rode on a colt (Zechariah 9:9, Matthew 21:1-7)
  - a healer (Isaiah 53:4-5, Matthew 8:16-17)
  - spoke in parables (Psalms 78:2, Matthew 13:34-35)
  - unbelief toward Him (Isaiah 53:1-3, John 12:37-41)
  - betrayed by a friend (Psalms 41:9, Mark 14:10-11)
  - sold for 30 pieces of silver (Zechariah 11:12, Matthew 26:14-15)
  - mocked and insulted (Psalms 22:6-8, Matthew 27:39-43)
  - cast lots for His garments (Psalms 22:18, John 19:23-24)
  - given gall and vinegar (Psalms 69:21, John 19:28-29)
  - His hands and feet pierced (Psalms 22:16, John 20:25-27)
  - crucified with sinners (Isaiah 53:12, Matthew 27:38)
  - raised from the dead and did not see corruption (Psalms 16:10, Acts 13:29-37)
- As followers of Christ, what applies to us in the Old Testament?
  - we are not bound to the carnal ordinances (Hebrews 9:8-10)
  - Jesus dealt with the heart (Matthew 5:27-29)
  - however, we still obey moral laws from the Old Testament
- What is the significance of the Old Testament today?
  - the Old Testament is a foundation for the New Testament
  - it was a foreshadowing of what was to come through Jesus (Hebrews 10:1)
  - Jesus came to fulfill the Old Testament, not destroy it (Matthew 5:17)
