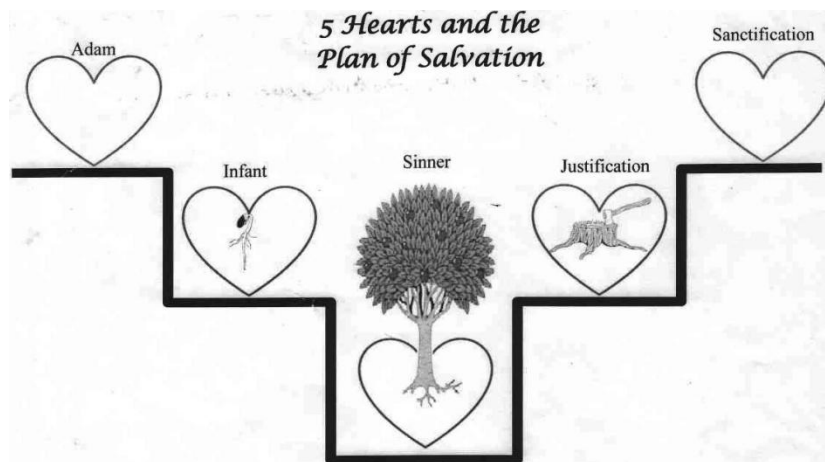


The Holy Ghost (Conclusion)

- The full plan of salvation includes 2 parts: justification and sanctification
 - parallel to Old testament tabernacle which had two rooms: the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place/Holiest of Holies (Exodus 26:31-34, Hebrews 10:19-20)
- Justification
 - takes care of the guilt from committed sin through repentance and faith (Mark 1:15)
 - a person is able to live holy in this state because holiness is a base requirement to make it to heaven (Hebrews 12:14)
 - in justification, God does just what we ask Him to do; He grants forgiveness for sin
 - however, this does not deal with the Adamic nature that every human being is born with that leads them into sin in the first place (Ephesians 2:1-3)
- Sanctification/The Holy Ghost
 - purges the Adamic nature and perfects us so that we are able to bring forth more fruit (John 15:1-2) although we are already bringing forth fruits of righteousness
 - we are set apart (sanctified/consecrated) by the Holy Ghost (I Peter 1:2)
 - the Holy Ghost seals us (Ephesians 1:13) and empowers us for service (Acts 1:8)
- Sin is a two-fold problem; therefore, a two-fold redemption is necessary



- We are justified through repentance and sanctified by presenting ourselves as a living sacrifice before God (Acts 2:37-38, Romans 12:1-2)
